## Golf Mansions

Live like a Player, a player or a Couples in one of these posh palaces



### The Finest Home of Its Type

▲ Plenty of golf real estate trades on the famous name of the course builder. But this five-bedroom stone-and-beam home at The Cliffs at Mountain Park, north of Greenville, S.C., does more than about the Gary Player design. It's Player's personal residence—complete with African-themed artwork and terraced landscaping approaching \$1 million. The home has two master suites, a gourmet kitchen and a four-car garage with an attached workshop for your club tinkering. At \$6.6 million, it's a little more expensive than a traditional piece of Player memorabilia. But the good news is that you'll get a pristine example of Player's signature—multiple times—at the closing.



### Couples Retreat

▼ The running joke about Fred Couples' enduring popularity is that men want to be him and women want to date him. Regardless of where you happen to fall in that spectrum, it's now possible to live like him—if you have \$3.95 million. Couples' four-bedroom, 5,100-square-foot villa at the Madison Club in La Quinta, Calif., is on the market. It has a master suite with an oversize soaking tub and an outdoor shower, and an upstairs media room where you can watch highlights from the 1992 Masters and cry right along with Jim Nantz. The home even comes furnished, so you can be lounging comfortably on day one.



### Hamptons High Life

▲ If you have trouble choosing which chopper to take from your private Manhattan helipad, this \$45 million, four-acre Southampton estate might be for you. It has 10 bedrooms and 10½ bathrooms among its 15,500 square feet, with a professional-caliber two-lane bowling alley, rooftop putting green and two-bedroom, two-bath guest cottage. There's even enough open acreage to build a full-size golf hole—a backup if you don't happen to get into Shinnecock or National Golf Links right down the road. —Matthew Rudy
